Mesa Man Wins New Jaguar in \$78K Prize Package; Group of Four Valley Co-workers Must Decide How to Split One Jeep, One Trip and \$13K

Health & Wealth Raffle Early Bird prize winners were drawn yesterday – Only a few thousand tickets remain for Final Draw for 10,000 prizes

Net Proceeds Benefit St. Joseph's Hospital and Barrow Neurological Institute

What:

A Mesa man and a Litchfield Park resident holding a ticket for a group of co-workers are the big winners in yesterday's drawing for **two Early Bird prizes** in the Spring 2006 Health & Wealth Raffle:

- Mesa resident **David Watson**, 64, won **Early Bird Prize #1** – A 2006 Jaguar S-type 4.2, plus a four-night trip to London, England, and \$17,000 cash. Prize package value: more than \$78,000.

Watson says the news has not sunk in yet. "I thought I used up all of my luck on Sunday when I got a birdie on the golf course," he quips.

A native of upstate New York and resident of Arizona for 28 years, Watson recently retired from a long career as a mechanical technician.

He purchased one three-packet of tickets for \$250 because he felt it was a good cause.

"I also had a deal with my wife," he says. "I bought the Health & Wealth Raffle tickets and she bought the Girl Scout cookies!"

- The winning ticket for **Early Bird Prize #2** was registered to **Cajun Daley**, 32, of Litchfield Park, but **Daley shares the prize with three co-workers**.

The four chipped in to purchase one three-packet of tickets for \$250. Daley says that the friends joked about how they would probably win something small, like a toaster, and then have to figure out how to split the prize.

Now the four lucky winners will determine how they will share the second Early Bird Prize:– A **2006 Jeep Commander, plus a five-night trip to British Columbia and \$13,000 cash**. Prize package value: more than \$60,000.

"I am super excited," says Daley. "Everyone is jumping up and down here. I've never won anything before, and this is awesome!"

Daley has participated in the Health & Wealth Raffle since it began. "I don't have a personal connection to St. Joseph's or Barrow, but I always knew that even if I did not win, I was supporting a good cause," he says.
